PROCLAMATION

Whereas, Lyman Hall was born on April 12, 1724 to parents John and Mary (Street) Hall of South Elm Street in Wallingford, Connecticut; and

Whereas, after graduating from Yale College in 1747, Hall studied theology with his uncle Samuel Hall and became an ordained minister; and

Whereas, while working as a minister, he studied medicine and taught school in Fairfield; and

Whereas, Lyman Hall moved to Dorchester, South Carolina where he set up his medical practice; and

Whereas, in 1774 he was granted land in the Midway section of Georgia, which became his plantation, Hall's Knoll; and

Whereas, Hall was an active leader in the Revolutionary movement and was elected to represent Georgia in the Second Continental Congress in 1775; and

Whereas, he later became Governor of Georgia and one of 56 men to sign the Declaration of Independence; and

Whereas, the Town of Wallingford has honored Hall's life and his contributions to the independence of our country with the Lyman Hall Memorial at the Center Street Cemetery and the naming of Lyman Hall High School; and

Whereas, we are pleased that Lyman Hall's 300th birthday is being celebrated with a Ceremony at the Center Street Cemetery on April 13, 2024.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Vincent Cervoni, Mayor of the Town of Wallingford do hereby proclaim April 13, 2024 as:

in our community. We ask our citizens to join us as we honor Lyman Hall's life and accomplishments.
