Resident Disposal Center – 25 Pent Road For Residential Refuse, Recycling and Bulky Waste

Residents may deliver ONLY their own residential trash and recycling to the Resident Disposal Center (RDC). Commercial material is not acceptable. Proof of residency is required upon delivery.

VEHICLES: Only cars, vans and pickup trucks and small utility trailers attached to such vehicles can be used for resident disposal. Vehicles with commercial plates are not allowed.

FEE SCHEDULE FOR DISPOSAL OF RESIDENTIAL TRASH AND BULKY WASTE, Effective July 10, 2017:

Payment may be made by cash or local bank check only (no credit/debit cards)

ITEM	RATE
For each container of refuse (30 gallons or less, 40 pounds or less)	\$ 3.65
For each light item such as a storm or screen door, etc. (35 pounds or less)	\$ 3.00
For each heavy item such as a couch, mattress, etc. (over 35 pounds)	\$10.00
For each Freon-containing appliance such as an AC, refrigerator, etc. This charge covers the cost of extracting the Freon from the appliances	\$25.00
For each 20 pounds of bulky waste delivered Vehicles delivering bulky waste including construction and demo debris may be weighed twice to determine cost of disposal. Follow directions of the scale house operator. Your driver's license or vehicle registration will be held pending payment. Receipts will be available.	\$ 1.40

CENTER OPEN: Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday 8 a.m. - 4 p.m.
Saturday 7 a.m. - 3 p.m.

CENTER CLOSED: Wednesdays, Sundays, New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day.

RECYCLING: Residents delivering solid waste to the RDC are to recycle the following items: newspaper, magazines, junk mail, office paper; corrugated cardboard; metal food and beverage containers; glass food and beverage containers; plastics - numbers 1-7 (not all plastics are handled at the RDC, e.g. hard plastics; if you have a question, ask the operator); scrap metals; electronics and up to 5 gallons/day of used motor oil (**unmixed** with other chemicals)**. There is no charge to residents to recycle except for items containing Freon (see fee schedule). Lead-acid batteries must be recycled by redemption at retail battery outlets.

** There will be penalties for contaminating the tank.

WALLINGFORD SENIORS AND RESIDENTS WITH A MEDICARE CARD: These residents may purchase a permit and get a coupon book from Public Works: See rules for Coupon Program.

RANDOM CHECKING OF TRASH: The operator is required to randomly open bags and check trash delivered to the RDC in order to be sure that trash does not contain recyclable materials or other materials that are not allowed under the program.

TRAFFIC AND PERSONAL SAFETY: In order to ensure the safety of all people participating in this program, people waiting in line to gain access to the RDC must stay in their cars. Children must not be allowed to run free either alongside the road or inside the RDC.

LITTER CONTROL: The Town Solid Waste Ordinance requires that any person transporting trash in town secure such trash. Any pickup truck or trailer carrying trash must be covered. There is a fine of up to \$100 for violation of this ordinance. Residents waiting in line to enter the RDC must control their litter such as coffee cups. State statutes provide for a fine of up to \$250 for littering.

USE OF FACILITY AT RESIDENT'S RISK: Any person delivering trash to the RDC shall do so at his or her own risk. The Town and/or contractors of the Town are not responsible for property damage or personal injury.

SUSPENSION OR TERMINATION OF PRIVILEGES: The Town may suspend or terminate the privilege of any resident to use the RDC if the resident does not follow the rules of the program, including: not following the RDC operator's directions, abusing the RDC operator or others, delivering commercial and/or inappropriate waste, or failing to place material in the proper containers.
